RATING + FUNDING



In this chapter, learn how books are rated for age-appropriate content and discover which organizations are funding and advocating for placing porn in public schools.

BOOK RATINGS

[Book Looks](#) has developed a content rating system to help busy parents and librarians understand what's between the covers of a book. Books **rated 4** (obscene references to sexual activities) and **rated 5** (aberrant sexual activities such as bestiality) are **intended for adults only**, however many of these books are **available to Scottsdale students**. On the following pages, we'll share examples of what your child may find in their Scottsdale Unified library.

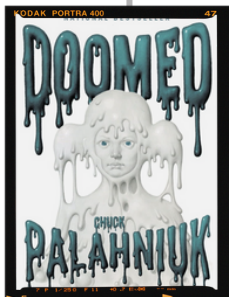

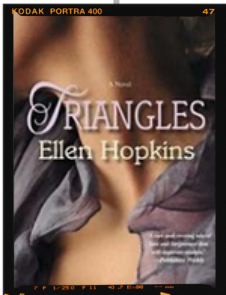
PUSH by Sapphire

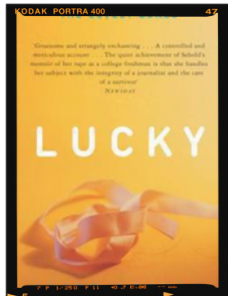


SOLD by Patricia McCormick

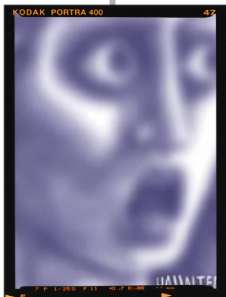

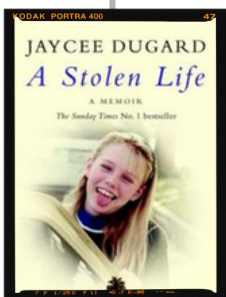
HAUNTED by Chuck Palahniuk

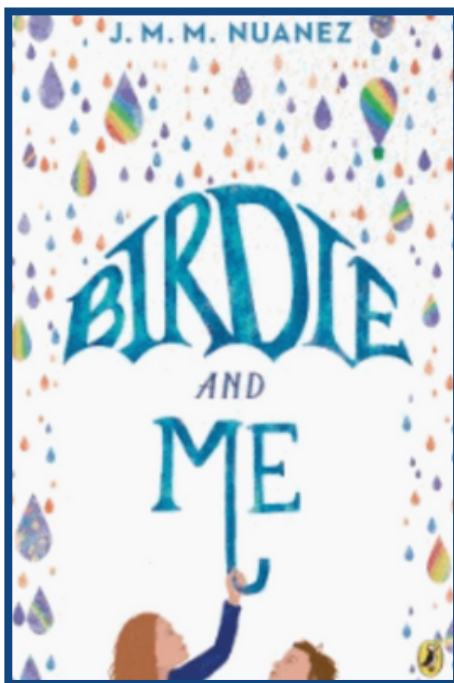
SYMPTOMS OF BEING HUMAN

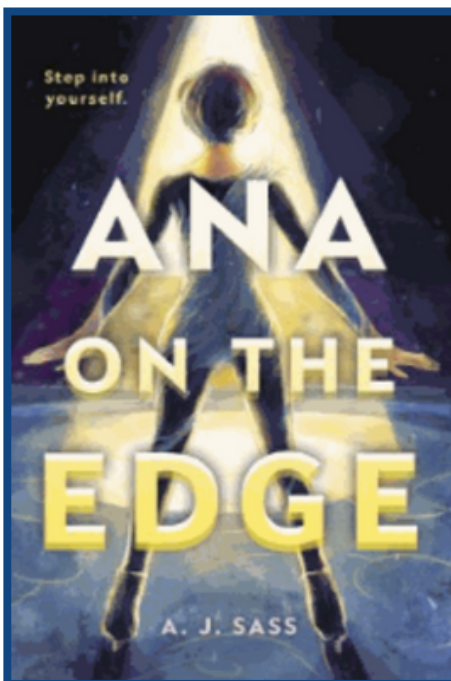
**BIRDIE AND ME**

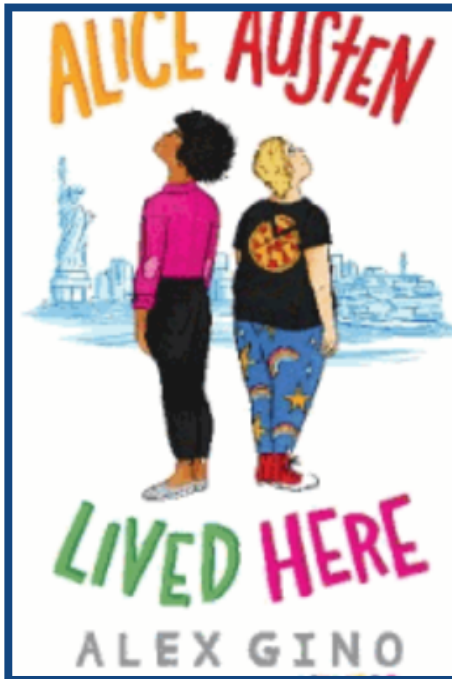
**SPIN WITH ME**

**ANNA ON THE EDGE**

"Ana-Marie Jin, the twelve-year-old U.S. Juvenile figure skating champion, has two different identities to juggle while on the ice after she meets transgender boy Hayden, who mistakes Ana for a boy. Ana does not correct Hayden, deciding to pretend to be a boy in order to not have to wear a princess-themed outfit for the next season's program. Ana and Hayden's friendship develops over a season filled with confusion and **questions about gender identity and what it means to think she is gender nonbinary.**

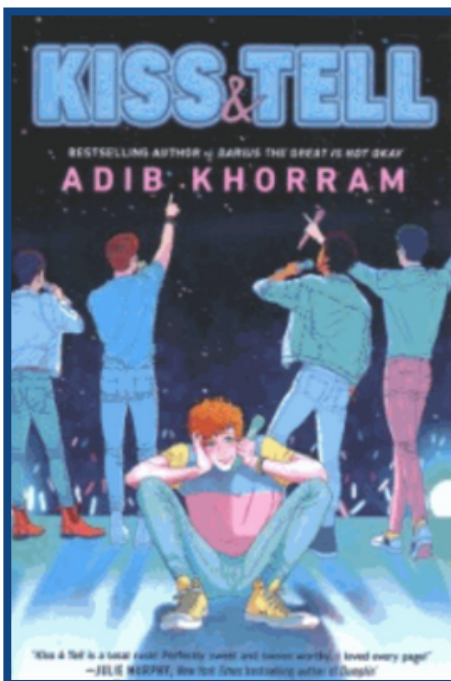
**I WISH YOU ALL THE BEST**

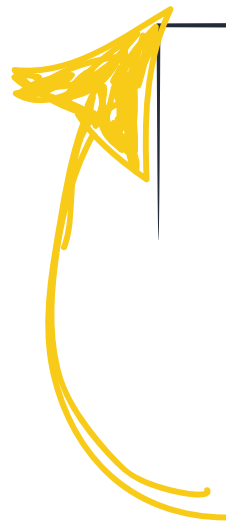
**KISS & TELL**

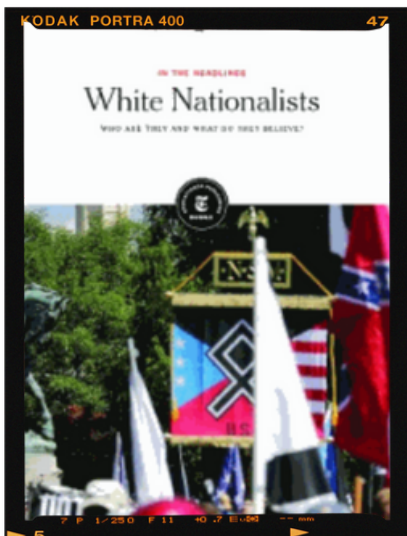
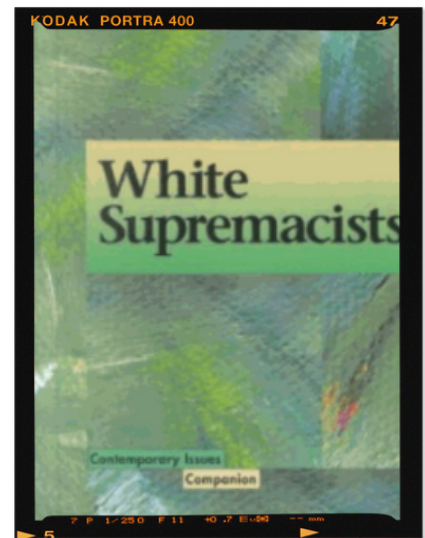
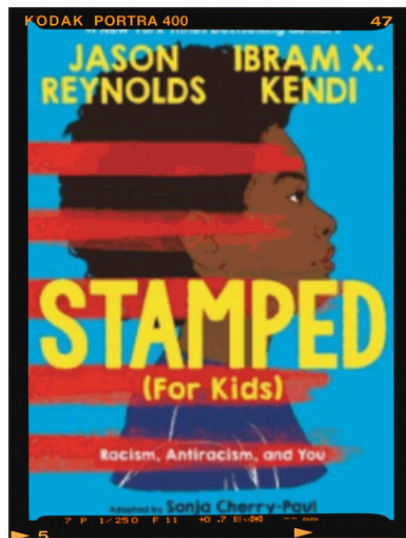
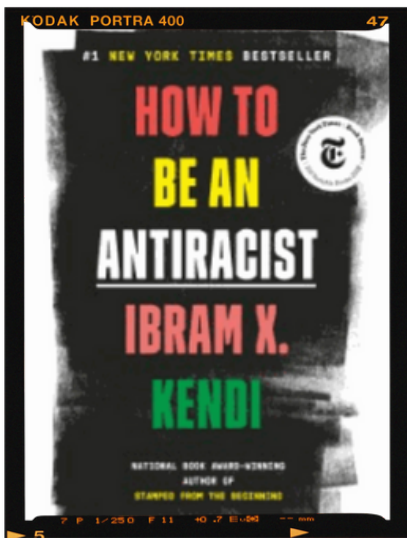
BOOKS ABOUT WHITE PRIVILEGE + RACISM

NOT MY IDEA: A BOOK ABOUT WHITENESS

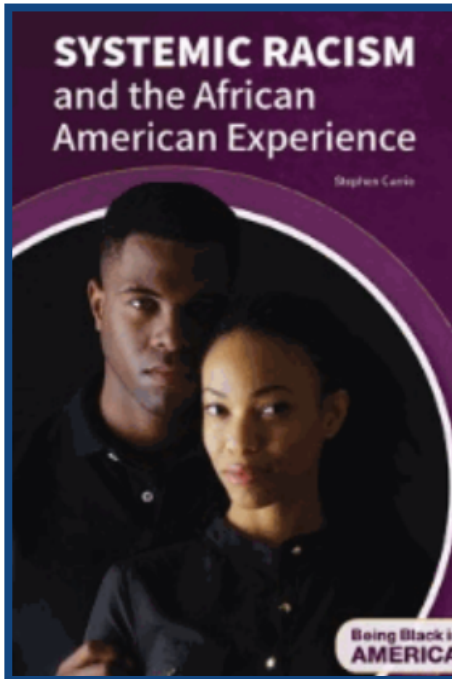
A young white child watches a news report of a white police officer shooting and killing a black man. The child's family refuses to answer the child's questions, so the child goes to the library to research **racism** in America and **learns that racism is a white person's problem and about the evils of white supremacy.**



THE BLACK FRIEND: ON BEING A BETTER WHITE PERSON

Chronicles the reflections of Frederick Joseph, award-winning marketing professional and writer, and other prominent African American artists, writers, and activists on their experiences with **racism** and white supremacy. **Discusses ways for white people to be anti-racist** through their behavior and knowledge. Includes a glossary.

SYSTEMIC RACISM

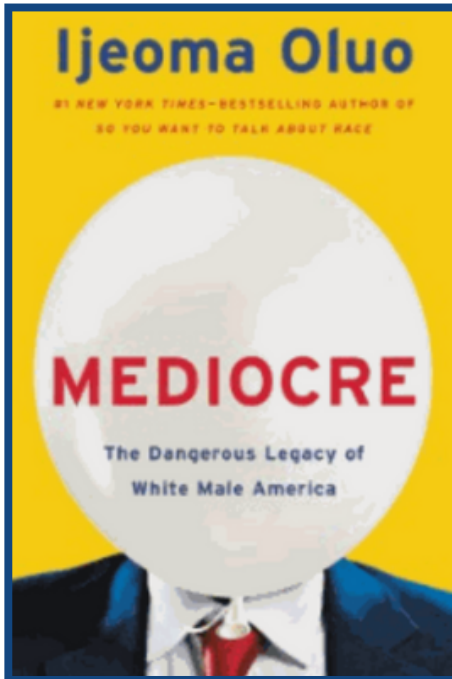
Explores **systemic racism** and race discrimination in housing, healthcare, education, employment, and policing in the United States. Includes color photographs and additional resources.



WHITE BALANCE: HOW HOLLYWOOD SHAPED COLORBLIND IDEOLOGY AND UNDERMINED CIVIL RIGHTS

Examines the role Hollywood movies played in affirming late twentieth century **colorblind ideology**-a model appearing to support diversity, but which in practice suppresses it.

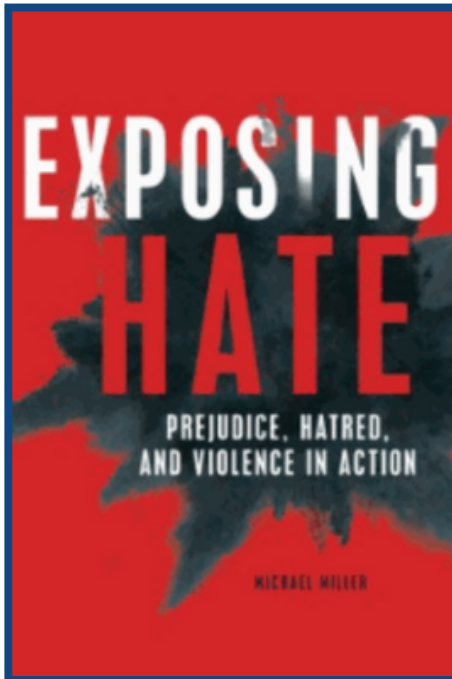
**MEDIOCRE**

Examines the historical impact of **white male privilege and supremacy** in the United States. Discusses how **white men have consistently erased and oppressed women** and minorities throughout history.

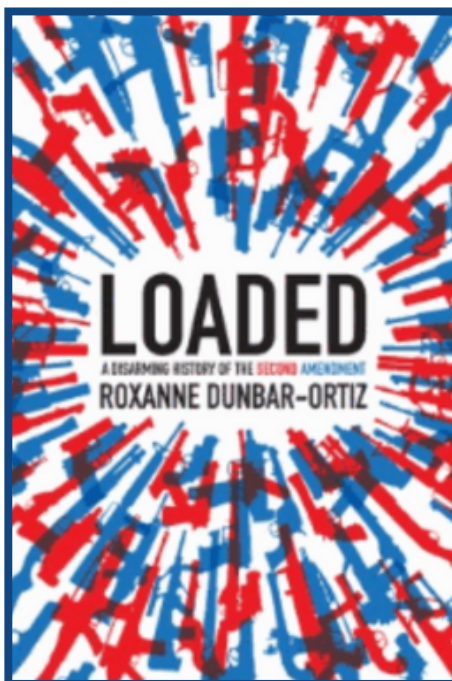
**CULTURAL APPROPRIATION**

Presents a collection of fifteen opposing essays related to cultural appropriation. Discusses free speech, **white privilege**, censorship, and cultural sharing.

**EXPOSING HATE**

Profiles hate groups in America from the early religious intolerance in the seventeenth century through the modern **spike after the election of Donald Trump**. Discusses the motives behind various types of hate groups, be it anti-Semitism, **anti-immigration, or male supremacy**, and what's being done to counter them.

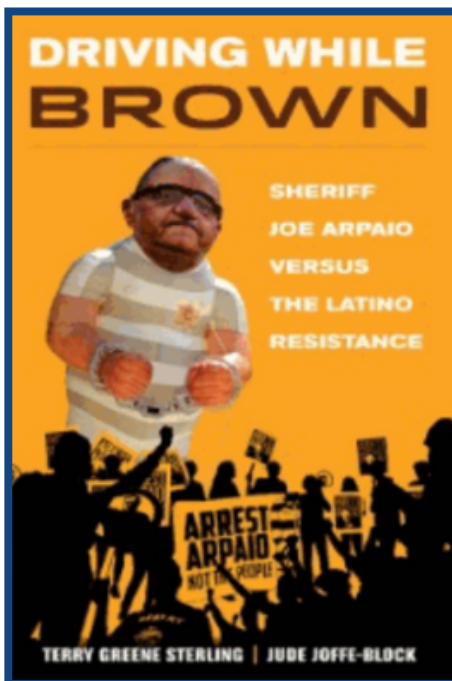
Examines the history of the Second Amendment, gun laws, and **gun culture in America in the context of white nationalism**, slavery, and imperialism.

VOTER SUPPRESSION

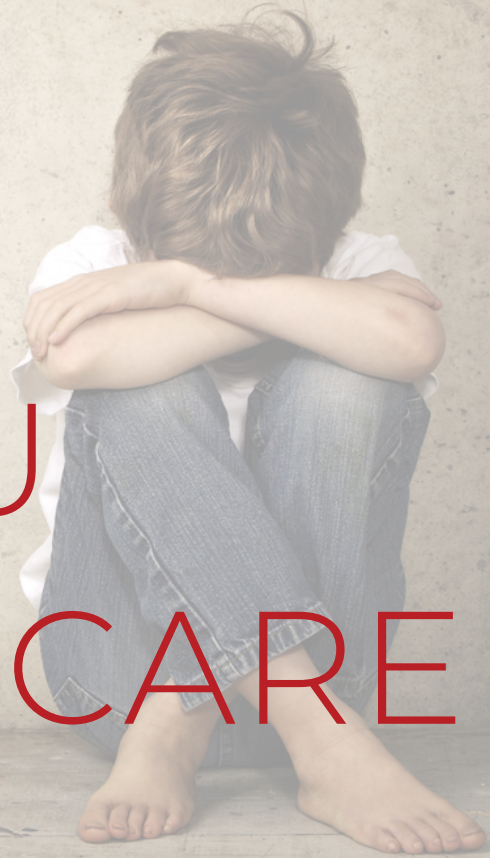
Contains a collection of articles published in the "New York Times" by various authors **exploring voter suppression** and its causes, effects, and possible solutions.



DRIVING WHILE BROWN: SHERIFF JOE ARPAIO VS. THE LATINO RESISTANCE

Chronicles the **anti-immigration enforcement policies** in Maricopa County, Arizona, under Sheriff Joe Arpaio and the Latino activists who fought back against the **institutionalized racism and racial profiling** of these policies and turned Arizona into a battleground state during the 2020 election. Examines how aggressive immigration enforcement played a role in Arpaio's political evolution.

WHY YOU SHOULD CARE



Exposing children to ideas that are too mature for their understanding can be harmful to their development. This section shares reports and new articles highlighting the negative impacts of early exposure, and names organizations funding the push to sexualize your children.

GENDER THEORY TOOLKIT

Gender and sexuality are being [weaponized as political tools](#). A reoccurring message to kids is that parents may not accept them and may actually be a danger to their children. SUSD Board Member [Libby Hart Wells](#) said as much during a board meeting.

THE SEXUALIZATION OF CHILDREN

Who should decide when and how to discuss issues like sex and gender with young children? Just a decade ago, this was thought to be the sole purview of parents. But that is no longer the case. Why is this shift happening, and who’s behind it? ([5-minute video](#)).

“Yet parents don’t want children to be exposed to books and classroom materials that show explicit pictures of sexual activity or replace sexual biology in favor of the ambiguous concept of gender.”

Read Across America Day is an annual event promoted by the National Education Association (NEA) to celebrate the joy of reading. Last year the NEA joined with the Human Rights Campaign, the nation's largest LGBTQ lobby, to co-sponsor the event.

SEX EDUCATION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS: SEXUALIZATION OF CHILDREN AND LGBT INDOCTRINATION

"Well-funded international pressure groups have been extraordinarily successful in pushing what they call "Comprehensive Sexuality Education" (CSE) into American public schools, an agenda-driven curriculum that sexualizes children. Once received by the school library a note will be added to the student's destiny account which will appear as an alert upon check out. It is important to note that this does not restrict free access for other students."

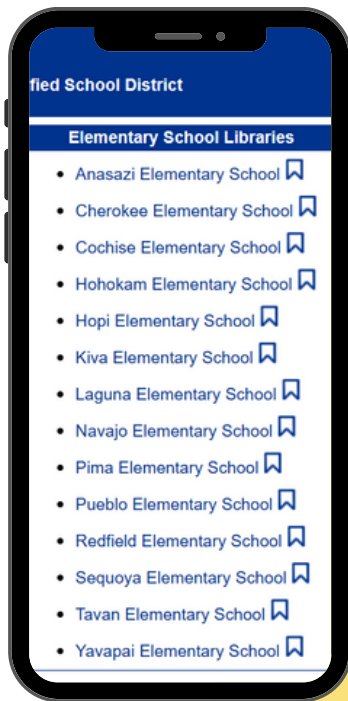

REVIEW NEW LIBRARY BOOK PURCHASES

Beginning in January 2023, Arizona law now requires schools to post a list of all new books purchased. Parents should receive an email notice alerting when new book posting will be published, and [the list](#) can be viewed online.

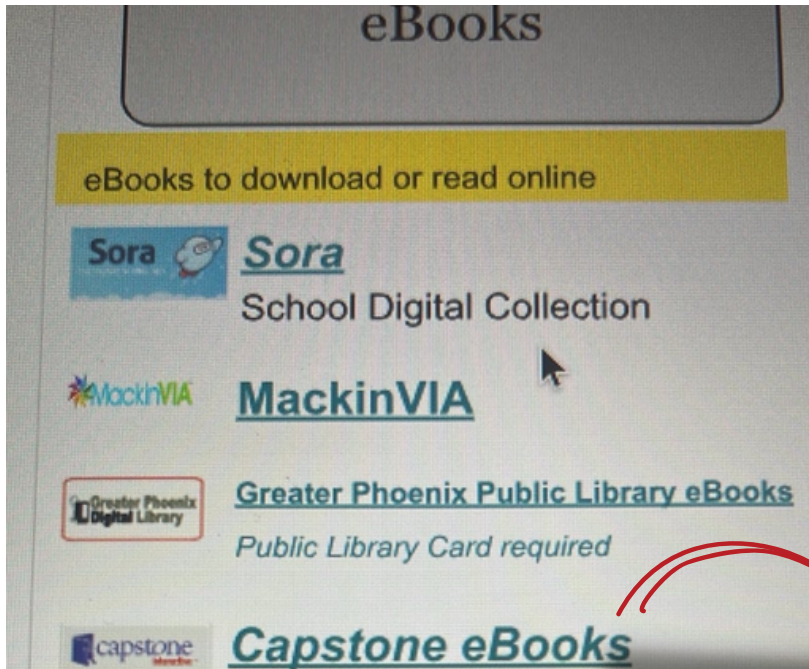

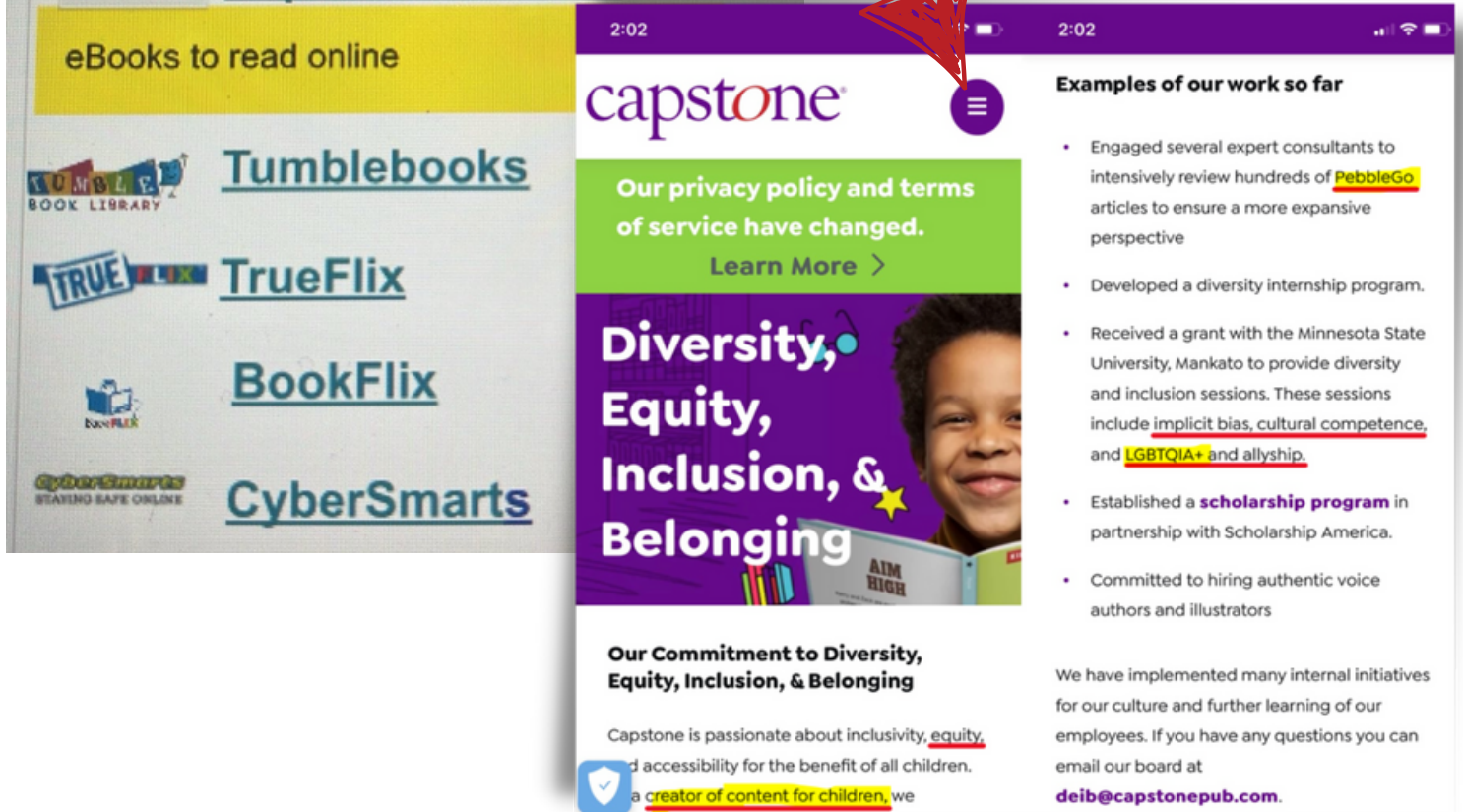

ARIZONA LAWS

SEXUAL CONTENT & PROTECTING MINORS

1

A.R.S. 15-711 - SEXUAL EDUCATION

School districts and charter schools may not provide sex education instruction before grade five. ...Before a parent provides written permission for the parent's child to participate in any sex education curricula, the school district or charter school shall make the sex education curricula available for the parent's review online and in person.

2

A.R.S. 13-3506 - DISTRIBUTION TO MINORS

It is unlawful for any person, with knowledge of the character of the item involved, to recklessly furnish, present, provide, make available, give, lend, show, advertise or distribute to minors any item that is harmful to minors.

3

A.R.S. 13-3501 - DEFINITION OF HARMFUL

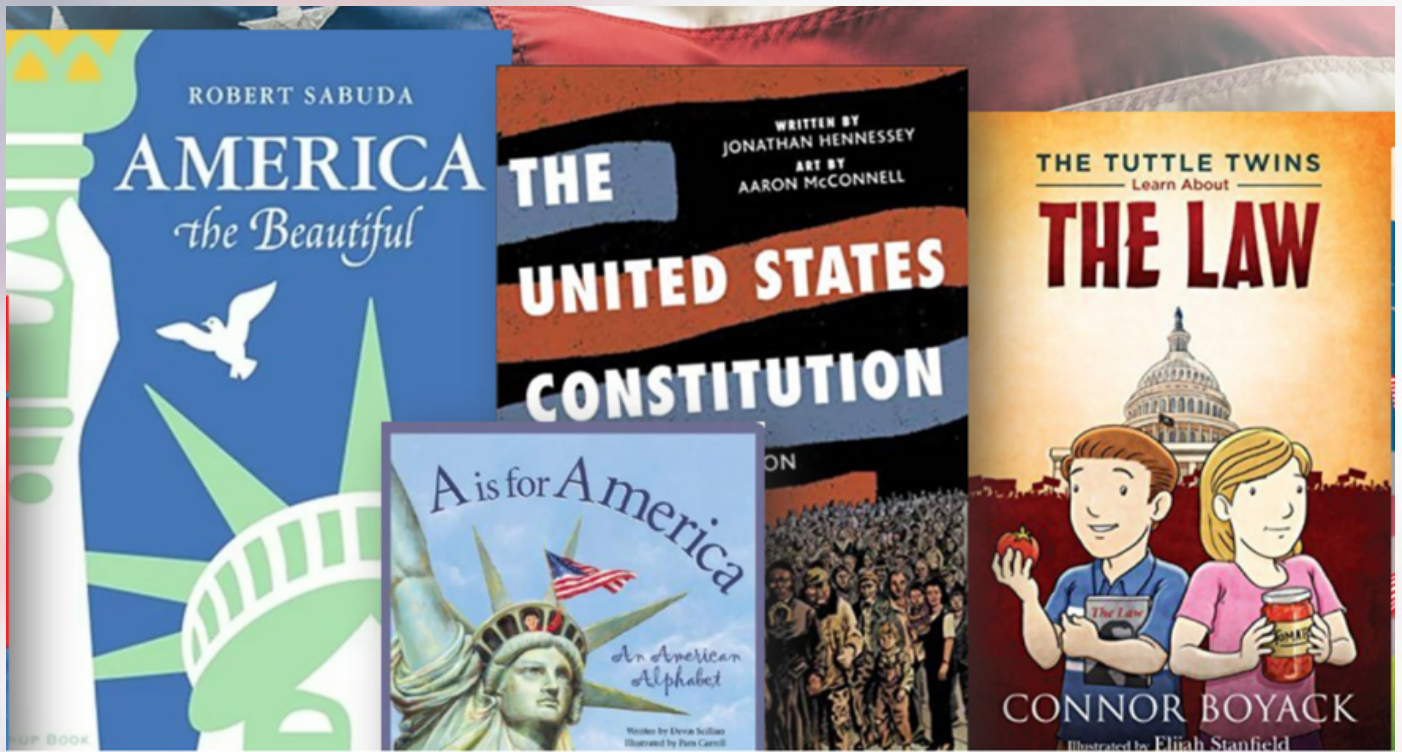
"Harmful to minors" means that quality of any description or representation, in whatever form, of nudity, sexual activity, sexual conduct, sexual excitement, or sadomasochistic abuse ...,

The working definition of sexuality is:

"...a central aspect of being human throughout life encompasses sex, gender identities and roles, sexual orientation, eroticism, pleasure, intimacy and reproduction.
